Business Privilege and Store License Renewals Extended

Montgomery—The Alabama Department of Revenue (ADOR) announced today that the annual October renewal period for business privilege and store licenses has been extended through Nov. 30, 2011, to allow business owners additional time to comply with provisions of the 2011 Beason-Hammon Alabama Taxpayer and Citizen Protection Act.

The business privilege license and the store license are combination county and state licenses that are issued by the county license-issuing official of the county in which the business, profession or occupation is conducted.

The licenses expire September 30 and are renewed prior to November 1 each year.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE

EXTENSION OF TIME FOR RENEWING OCTOBER 2011 BUSINESS PRIVILEGE LICENSE OR STORE LICENSE. For the purposes of applying Alabama's Business Privilege License or Store License laws as related to the annual issuance or renewal during the month of October 2011, the deadline has been extended through November 30, 2011, without payment of penalty for business owners.
