#### ORDINANCE NO. 24-O-\

### AMENDING SECTION 33.10(c) PROHIBITING THE CARRY OF CONCEALED PISTOLS WITHOUT A LICENSE

WHEREAS, by Act 2022-133, which became effective January 1, 2023, the State of Alabama repealed the prohibition against a person carrying a concealed pistol without a permit;

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama has expressly preempted and fully occupied the field of regulation of firearms within the state;

WHEREAS, Section 33.10(c) makes it unlawful for a person to carry a concealed pistol without a license as previously required before the effective date of Act 2022-133; accordingly, Section 33.10(c) impermissibly conflicts with the laws of the State of Alabama;

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Anniston enacts this ordinance to make Section 33.10(c) consistent with the current laws of the State of Alabama;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. The Council for the City of Anniston, Alabama hereby amends and restates Section 33.10(c) of The Code of the City of Anniston, Alabama, 1981, to state in its entirety as follows:

#### Sec. 33.10. - Concealed weapons—Generally.

(c) No person shall knowingly possess or carry a pistol in any vehicle or concealed on or about his person in any place limited or prohibited by state or federal law or in any of the places identified in Alabama Code § 13A-11-61.2 without the express permission of a person or entity with authority over the premises, subject to those exceptions and conditions imposed under state law.

Section 2. This ordinance shall have force and effect in the police jurisdiction of the City of Anniston and shall take effect immediately upon the expiration of the thirtieth day following its passage and adoption and publication as required by law. The City Clerk shall publish this ordinance in The Anniston Star, a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of Anniston, Alabama, and shall submit a copy of this ordinance and proof of publication and 30-day notice of its applicability within the police jurisdiction to the Alabama Department of Revenue for posting on the Atlas Alabama state website in accordance with Ala. Code § 11-40-10.
